75 years since the END of the HOLOCAUST

Step back in time and follow The Journey of Leo, a 10 year old Jewish boy from Nazi Germany, back to safety in England. Listen to a holocaust survivor share her unique story.



Wednesday 15 April 2020

The National Holocaust Memorial Centre and Museum near Laxton, Nottinghamshire opened in 1995 providing a permanent memorial to the victims of the Holocaust. Around the Federation

BASTON WOMEN'S INSTITUTE - Several months ago, Baston WI were delighted to welcome George Hethington to their monthly meeting to tell them about Second Helpings, Stamford, which exists principally to intercept and use food which would otherwise go to landfill. We feel it is important for members to be made aware of their presence. Supermarkets and individuals donate their surplus fresh food and Second Helpings turn it into nutritious meals to serve in their cafe in Barn Hill Methodist Church every Saturday lunchtime. Meals are unpriced, with an average of 80 diners each time paying what they feel, either by cash or by donating time or skills. The cafe also ran each Wednesday during the last school summer holiday. Mr Hetherington told us how he came across The Real Junk Food Project about five years ago and was so impressed that he “sold” the idea to Barn Hill Methodists. Their support continues by providing premises for the cafe, a food store called “The Bunker” and for a community fridge. Second Helpings is staffed by an army of volunteers who hate waste and because of its existence, over the past four years some 70 tons of food have been saved from landfill. An important added bonus is that a community has developed with many people being helped and lives changed for the better. In her vote of thanks, Sharon Holmshaw thanked Mr Hetherington for his informative and impassioned talk which was right in line with the 2016 NFWI's resolution to reduce food waste and address food poverty.
