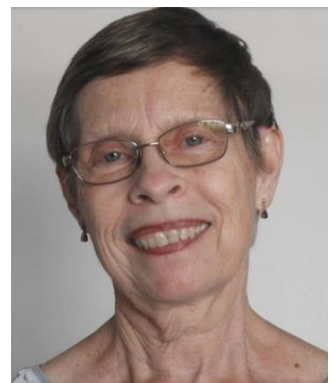
Write A Book In A Year with Hazel Goss

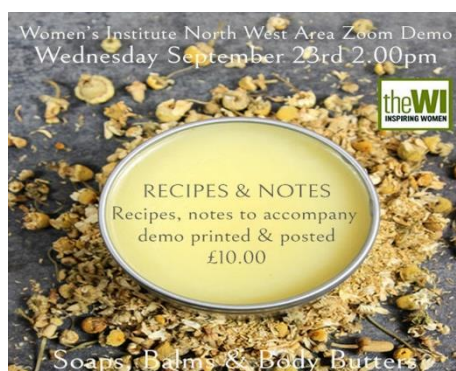

Macramé: Session1 Learn How To Make The Knots With Judith Stansfield

Thurs 8th Oct 2020 – 10.30am (Course Code MAC01)

Judith is the Chair of the Craft and Home Economics Committee. This session is for those of you who have never done macramé or have forgotten the details of how to make the knots that are used to make plant holders, wall hangings, bags etc.

She will go through the basic knots that are used in making macramé in Session 1 and how to make a plant holder in Session 2.



You will need a curtain ring tied to something firm like a chair back or table leg and eight 1 metre lengths of string, cord or thick wool in four different colours.

If you don't have different colours, you can colour the ends with different coloured felt-tips to help you identify which cord you are working with.
